Board of Health Tick Season is Here (Always)



OUR GRANT HAS BEEN EXTENDED!

Leyden Residents are eligible for reduced-rate tick testing. If you or your pet have been bitten (the tick was attached to your skin) by a Deer Tick, save the tick in a small, plastic bag.

Log on to <u>www.tickreport.com</u> and follow the instructions for mailing the tick, or call Lisa White, R.N. at 413-665-1400, extension 114 and she will help you through the process.

The Leyden Board of Health, in Conjunction with the Cooperative Public Health Services of the Franklin Regional Counsel of Governments, has negotiated a reduced cost to member towns. *Leyden residents need pay only \$15.00* of the \$50.00 cost of getting a tick tested.

Data collected over the last year for the ten towns participating in the testing grant, show that approximately 35% of ticks are infected with Lyme disease. Additionally, several more diseases are now associated with tick bites.

WiredWest

WiredWest people who have met with the new MBI Town liaison person, Bill Ennen, feel he is an ally. He is from an unserved part of Shelburne and understands the problems caused by lack of broadband. In meeting with the Leyden Broadband Committee and Selectboard on June 16th, he mentioned more than once his strong conviction that a regional solution is the most likely path to sustainable broadband access for all towns. However, he is constrained by the MBI policy that each town must own all of the network assets it pays for. His mission is to get towns to build individual networks first and then regionalize when actual operation becomes possible. Some in WiredWest are afraid this approach may not work for towns, especially small towns that cannot demonstrate sustainability as a single town network. Leyden has submitted a "Readiness Request Form" that will lead to the next step in getting state aid for the detailed engineering studies that are necessary before network construction can start.

WiredWest has announced a new operating plan, called the A2 option, which accepts the MBI's requirement that each town individually own its network assets. The new plan also makes it easy for a town to withdraw from WiredWest membership, and anticipates outsourcing operations. Details are now available on the WiredWest WiredWest Executive Committee website, http://wiredwest.net . members have met with the new leadership of MBI, but came away feeling that the MBI people did not appear to have read or be familiar with A2. One WiredWest negotiator was told by Bill Ennen that WW was hoping to hear something that MBI is not yet able to say. We don't know what this means. We have also heard that the state may be working on its own "consortium" model that they will be presenting to towns sometime soon. This appears to be happening simultaneously with the town readiness assessment process. They are saying very little about what that will look like. It has been suggested that town officials and residents should be writing to the Governor and Peter Larkin, insisting that MBI engage in constructive dialog with WW to find a common solution to the need for regionalization necessary to make operating expenses affordable for small towns.

As you may know, WiredWest Delegates constitute the Board of Directors of WiredWest, which normally meets once a month in a different WiredWest town, usually in the Town Hall. Over the past several years Sheila and Al have had a fantastic tour of Western Massachusetts Town Halls, schools, and other public buildings. In November 2013 Leyden hosted one of these meetings, and we have volunteered to do so again. The WiredWest Board of Directors will meet in Leyden Town Hall on Saturday July 23rd at 9:30 AM. We invite Leyden residents to come and observe the meeting. You'll see a group of committed and intelligent, informed people from all over our region seriously discussing our way forward to broadband. Some members will have driven for up to an hour and a half to get to this meeting and for that reason the host town always provides coffee and breakfast snacks starting at 9:00 AM. We would appreciate help from a few people with this by making coffee or donating baked goods.

Re: Press Release for Household Hazardous Waste Day

ANNUAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION EVENT

The Franklin County Solid Waste District is holding its annual household hazardous waste collection on Saturday, October 1st at GCC Main Campus and Orange Transfer Station.

Residents and businesses must pre-register between August 25 and September 26. Online registration forms may be completed online at that time: www.franklincountywastedistrict.org/hazwasteday.html. Paper registration forms will be available at participating town offices and transfer stations. Participants will be assigned an appointment time to bring wastes to the collection; appointment time will be provided by mail after registration is processed.

The collection is free for residents of the following towns: Athol, Bernardston, Buckland, Charlemont, Colrain, Conway, Deerfield, Erving, Hawley, Heath, Leverett, Montague, New Salem, Northfield, Petersham, Phillipston, Rowe, Royalston, Shelburne, Warwick, Wendell, and Whately. Barre, Gill, Orange and Sunderland residents must pay to participate in the 2016 collection.

Greenfield and Leyden residents are not eligible; call 772-1528 for info on year round disposal in Greenfield.

Businesses must pay for disposal costs. For business registration information, call (413) 772-2438.

This collection provides an opportunity to dispose of hazardous items such as leftover oil-based paints, stains, thinners, household cleaners, pesticides, herbicides, pool chemicals, motor oil, antifreeze, fluorescent lamps, automobile batteries, and other household chemicals.
