Letter from Candidate Barbara Wallace

I am running for a five-year term on the Planning Board, and would like to take this opportunity to outline my background and qualifications.

My husband, John, and I bought our land in Leyden on Alexander Road in 1995, where we built a house that we moved into in January of 1997. We felt then, and even more so now, that we had found our true home. My desire to serve the town is in part an expression of my gratitude for being able to call Leyden home. In addition, my professional background has equipped me with skills and experience that make me a strong candidate for the Planning Board.

My early career was in education. While living in California, I taught all subjects in the 7th grade and also taught at Golden Gate College at night. I taught math and biology in North Carolina, and I was a part-time faculty member in the business school at Western New England College in Springfield. In addition, I spent a year working with emotionally disturbed children at the Pioneer Valley Collaborative.

After earning an MBA at the University of Massachusetts, I started my banking career at Bank of Boston in 1986 as an AVP of Commercial Lending. In 1989 I moved to The Bank of Western Massachusetts where I worked for almost 20 years, retiring in 2009. I held many positions while in the Springfield office, including VP Commercial Lender, analyzing requests for loans and managing a multi million dollar portfolio of loan relationships; and VP of Operations running technology, mergers, branches, building of branches, human resources and training. In 2001 I was able to transfer to the Greenfield office where I was SVP of Commercial Lending, managing sales for the Northern offices and Municipal Banking. I was part of the Bank's Senior Management team for nine years.

My volunteer activities included the Advisory Board of the Isenberg School of Management at the University of Massachusetts; Trustee of Greenfield Community College; board member and Treasurer of the Women's Fund of Western Massachusetts; Co-founder of Women on Board, a not-for-profit organization to put women on Boards in the Pioneer Valley; Treasurer of Springfield Theatre Arts; Finance Committee of the Springfield Library and Museum Association; board member of the Pioneer Plan for Progress; board member of Westmass Area Development Corporation; board member of CISA; supervisor at NRCS; board member and past President of Franklin County Chamber of Commerce; and board member of the Greenfield YMCA.

From this varied background I can bring to the Planning Board an ability to build team work, handle complex issues where different views are present, understand, educate and manage expectations about Leyden's development, and be proactive about developing and understanding the community's long-term goals. Having provided commercial loans to many real estate developments, I am familiar with many of the towns' regulations. My sense of humor and directness, key to my past success, would certainly be a part of what I would bring to the Planning Board.

John and I have two children and three grandchildren and another grandchild on the way. We are blessed that they all live in Massachusetts and visit often. Maple Run Farm has horses, bees, chickens, sheep, dog and cat. You have probably seen our ads in *Leyden Life*.

Letter from Candidate Jerry Lund

To Leyden Voters:

I hope I may take a little of your time to share with you some of my thoughts as a member of the Leyden Planning Board running for re-election this year. I have served two terms on the board, most of it as chair, during which time we have accomplished a lot for our town.

Most recently:

—as the Planning Board representative and chair of the Leyden Open Space Committee I oversaw the successful revision of our 2004-2009 Open Space and Recreation Plan. After sixteen months of work, our committee, working together with the Franklin Regional Council of Government's Planning Department, has finished the 2010-2017 Plan and will be presenting it to town meeting for approval. Among many other aspects the Plan's renewal will help maintain Leyden's competitiveness for state grants as funds are becoming scarce.

In the past few years our Board:

- -revised our outdated subdivision control bylaws,
- —worked to update and clarify the Special Permit criteria and procedures of our zoning bylaws with the assistance of the FRCOG Planning Department (only partly approved by town meeting), and

—developed a cell tower bylaw to protect the town from arbitrary siting of cell towers.

Present projects include adding a Flood Plain Overlay District to our bylaws so that the town may join the state Flood Plain Program (as decided at the April town meeting), revising our signage regulations, developing an accessory apartment bylaw, and finishing the revisions to our Special Permit bylaws. On top of all this the legislature may completely revise the Zoning Act this year, which will lead most towns to make changes to their local zoning laws.

I mention all this to make one simple point. Our (your!) Planning Board has shown by its hard work its complete commitment to making our town's land-use (zoning) laws work to maintain our town's most treasured asset for its people—our rural character. I hope you will give me the chance to continue this important work by giving me your vote on May 14th.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to take part in this work.
