Board of Health

Fall is coming shortly and people may be wondering about flu vaccines. We have been guaranteed 90 doses this year that we can administer to our residents free of charge. The Flu Clinic will take place on election day, <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 6th</u> from 5:00 to 7:00 PM downstairs in the Town Hall. We are going to try to hold a blood pressure clinic at the same time if staffing permits.

We have been updating our files, and in doing so have noticed that many homes do not have current septic pumping reports in their files. Please take a few minutes to check your records at home to make sure yours was pumped within the last 3-5 years, depending on usage. This will save you from having major problems in the future. Each company that pumps out septic tanks is required by state law to send the report to the Board of Health within 10-15 days.

Just a reminder from your Board of Health: When you use either the Town Hall kitchen or the one at Avery Field, please remove all trash from the rest rooms, kitchen and any areas you use. Counters and sink areas must be sanitized with bleach/water mixture both before and after use. Stoves are to be left clean (no grease, please), as well as any utensils used. Dishes and silverware must be washed, rinsed and sanitized before they are put away to prevent the spread of bacteria and illness-causing organisms. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE THESE THINGS FOR THE NEXT GROUP TO DO. Let's all work together to keep our residents free of disease.

The Board of Health has copies of hand-washing and allergen posters, if any group needs them to post at functions (both need to be posted at each event). They're free—just call Gloria at 774- 7113. We do inspect the above-named kitchens as required by the Massachusetts Department of Health as a free service to our town. All functions selling food to the public must have a Serve-Safe certificate and a temporary food permit displayed in the kitchen. The temporary food permit can be obtained by filling out a request form for the Board of Health. The permit is also free to Leyden organizations.

Cecilia Tusinski's work "Gaza Walls" was recently accepted into Josh Simpson's Salmon Falls Gallery in Shelburne Falls and will be on display through February 2013. Says Cecilia:

The Gaza Walls series consists of four 12"x 12" canvas panels. Each panel is mounted in a hand-rubbed birch 'float frame', the inside of which is painted matte black, making the paintings appear to 'float' in the frame. The paintings are reminiscent of sun-baked walls with pigments of yellow ochre, white, burnt umber, red and gold, and include small pieces of Arabic newsprint incorporated into the heavily distressed surfaces. These came from a newspaper published on the day of the invasion of Iraq, 20 March, 2003. Although traces of previous human existence lie all around us, perhaps nowhere is this more evident than the multi-layered walls of ancient towns in the Middle East. These ephemeral traces of past and present civilizations are the inspiration for this series of works."

In the studio Cecilia is working on several light and atmospheric pieces, predominantly in the white/yellow/dusty orange color spectrum - mostly watercolor with some acrylic for texture: "My 'summer series' of works on paper, and paintings to keep cool with! I'm saving the heavy darker, textured oil paintings for the winter—paintings to warm up by!"



Save the Dates: Fall Collection Days ANNUAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

The District is holding its annual hazardous waste collection on **Saturday**, **September 22**, at GCC Main Campus and Orange Transfer Station. This annual collection provides residents an opportunity to dispose of hazardous items such as leftover oilbased paints, stains, thinners, household cleaners, pesticides, pool chemicals, motor oil, antifreeze, fluorescent lamps, automobile batteries, and other household chemicals. For a complete list of acceptable items, please refer the District's website www.franklincountywastedistrict.org/hazwasteday.html.

To participate, residents must pre-register by September 14th. After registration is processed, your appointment time and directions to the location will be mailed to you. Businesses must pre-register with an inventory of their wastes and will be charged for disposal. Starting in mid-late August, registration forms will be available in local newspapers, at town offices, transfer stations, and at: www.franklincountywastedistrict.org.

FALL "CLEAN SWEEP" BULKY WASTE COLLECTION

The District is holding its fall "Clean Sweep" bulky waste collection on **Saturday, October 20**th, from 9 AM to 12 NOON. The three drop-off sites are: the Buckland Recreation Facility on Rt. 112 South, the Northfield Highway Garage, and the Whately Transfer Station. District residents may bring a wide range of items such as tires, appliances, scrap metal, furniture, mattresses, carpeting, construction debris, computers, monitors, televisions, propane gas tanks, and other bulky items. Materials will be recycled whenever possible.

Residents do not need to pre-register for the bulky waste collection. However, there are charges for disposal. Disposal fees, in cash only, will be collected at each site. A complete list of prices for the most common items will be available at town halls, town transfer stations, the District office at 50 Miles Street in Greenfield, and on-line at: www.franklincountywaste district.org/cleansweep.html. Businesses may participate.

Don't flush prescription drugs! The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has scheduled another National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day, which will take place on Saturday, September 29, 2012, from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. This is a great opportunity for those who missed the previous events, or who have subsequently accumulated unwanted, unused prescription drugs, to safely dispose of those medications.
