Hilltowns History Conference and Fair

The Mary Lyon Foundation gratefully acknowledges the award of \$200 from the Leyden Local Cultural Council for the Fall 2012 public history event that is now called the "Hilltowns History Conference and Fair." It will be held on Saturday, October 13th at the Colrain Central School.

In our LCC application, the event was called "Raising the Flag," because it is being held to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the first raising of the flag over an American school house, which occurred on Catamount Hill in Colrain in 1812. We were in the early planning stages at that time. The new title better reflects our original intent, to host a day of learning about the history of the hilltowns. The conference program is packed with workshops on the history of agriculture, industry, Native American presence, landscape, transportation, and more. An outdoor fair will include demonstrations, displays, and representation of hilltown historical societies.

Dennis Picard, director of Storowton Village at the Big E and a favorite public historian and re-enactor, will portray a Massachusetts Militia Man from the 1812 era. Dennis tells me that the Town of Leyden is still in possession of militia knapsacks and canteens from that era, and that the Leyden artifacts were used as models for reproductions. That is one special Leyden connection to this conference.

The Serving Health Information Needs of Elders (SHINE) program was founded in 1988 and has helped more than 400,000 Massachusetts seniors and disabled persons save money on their health care costs. The Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs administers the program statewide, and the Central Massachusetts Association on Councils on Aging (COA) hosts programs in 63 cities and towns throughout Massachusetts. SHINE counselors provide **free** Medicare counseling.

You can call 1-800-AGE-INFO (1-800-243-4636), then press or say "3". Once you get the SHINE answering machine, leave your name and number. A volunteer will call you back as soon as possible. Or for assistance from a Medicare customer service representative 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, call 1-800-MEDICARE.
