Pastel Impressionist Workshop

On <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>December 18th</u> from 6:00 to 8:00 pm "Que Sera, Seurat: How to Pastel Paint Optically with Color," a pastel workshop, will be presented by Gregory Maichack downstairs at Town Hall. The workshop will provide insights into Pointillism, Seurat's and Signac's working methods in Neo-Impressionism. Mr. Maichack demonstrates how to use pastels in any style, coaching participants as they attempt their own pastel paintings. All materials are provided, including pastels and paper. This workshop is appropriate for adults.

"It's amazing to see adult beginners side-by-side with advanced painters enjoy and benefit from this deeply researched program," said Maichack, who has presented hundreds of similar workshops in pastel focusing on other artists' techniques, from da Vinci, through Monet and van Gogh, to Georgia O'Keeffe. <u>DO</u> include corrugated cardboard boxes; paperboard gift boxes; greeting cards (except those with foil, metallic inks, or glitter); paper shopping bags (any type of handle is OK); catalogs and calendars.

<u>DO NOT</u> include ribbons; bows; tinsel; packing peanuts and Styrofoam (re-usable—contact your local pack and ship store); holiday lights; and plastic bags.

Thanks to all those who took the time on election day to fill out the WiredWest support cards. You are helping Leyden get the best Wi-Fi possible. Eighty-three new names were added, to bring us up to 55% of our residents. One hundred sixty-two out of 294 households have added their votes for this incredibly necessary initiative. The support cards are not a survey about who has DSL and who doesn't, which is why we were particularly grateful for those of you who have some sort of Wi-Fi and still took the time to respond. Now we need the rest of you to help us as well. By my count, we still need responses from 132 households! Once again, I will do anything I can to help. Call me at 774-5922 if you would like me to enter your support. I will see to it that it is done immediately. You can also respond online at WiredWest.net. But please do something as soon as possible to add your voice for all of us. This is important because *funders are listening, as are interested service providers*.

Leyden is a charter member of the WiredWest Cooperative. WiredWest is a municipal co-op of 40 towns that are working together to build a fiber-optic network to offer ultra-high-speed internet, telephone and high definition video at reasonable rates to residents and businesses.

The WiredWest network is extremely important to the future of our town. It will create local jobs, improve education and healthcare, and support our regional economy. Even if you have DSL, wireless or cable from a private company, switching to WiredWest has enormous benefits for you personally, and for our community, including:

Far superior service – There is no other delivery system for telecommunications that provides service as quickly, reliably and affordably as fiber-optic. It is only technology that will support our data needs for decades into the future, and give you state-of-the-art service today.

Keeps revenues here – Today your payments for phone, internet and television service go to out-of-state companies and their shareholders. For just the WiredWest towns, that's over \$50 million per year. Imagine the effect on our local economy if that money stayed here?
