New Transfer Station Entry Rules

Beginning July 1st, the Greenfield Department of Public Works will begin selling resident stickers. Residents of Greenfield and Leyden must purchase the sticker for \$5, and it will be good for two *fiscal* years (7/1/13 - 6/30/15). A sticker is required for every vehicle that you plan to drive to the Transfer Station.


You must show proof of registration when purchasing the sticker. The sticker must be purchased at the Department of Public Works in Greenfield Town Hall. Effective, August 1st, residents must permanently display the sticker on the bottom of the windshield on the driver's side. Upon entrance to the Transfer Station, if the sticker is not displayed, non-resident rates will be charged. Current disposal rates will not change at this time. A new sticker will be required to be purchased by July 1, 2015.
