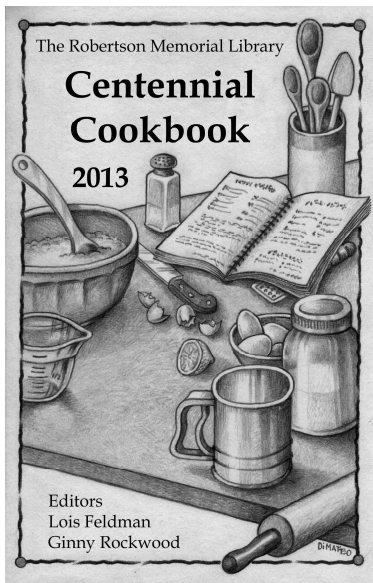

It's not Just a Cookbook



The Robertson Memorial Library Centennial Cookbook is published and out to rave reviews. Not only does it contain a wide assortment of tempting recipes from Leyden residents, but, there are photos and a concise history of the library. There are additional photos of historical buildings and maps of current and previous farms in town—all in all a little gem of a book.

WiredWest Progress

A hearing on the IT Bond Bill was held in Boston on September 18th. The WiredWest Executive Board and a number of individual WiredWest delegates attended to testify in support of inclusion of \$40 million for the Massachusetts Broadband Institute to support building out of the “last mile” fiber network.

Written testimony, including letters of support from Select Boards of Leyden and many other WiredWest towns was presented. Testimony in support was also heard from legislators from this area, including Paul Mark and Denise Andrews. I presented a statement which said, in part:

“Three years ago, looking forward to retirement, my wife and I moved to the small town of Leyden, population less than 800. We are fortunate to have DSL service, but it is not true broadband. I feel handicapped in work I do as a volunteer webmaster for an organization I belong to. I am also doing part-time consulting work, currently programming support software for a scientific data logging system, and if I had been contemplating making a living doing this full time I never would have moved to Leyden.

“In my final pre-retirement job working for the Greenfield Public Schools I witnessed an incredible expansion of the use of computers in school classrooms. The nature of computer use was also changing, with increased reliance on the ability to access streaming audio and video. It stands to reason that as computer use in the schools requires greater bandwidth, students are also going to need more bandwidth at home.

“My main point is that lack of broadband access has a serious effect on a town like mine. In a recent Leyden Town Meeting a comment was made that there is an excessive number of homes for sale in our town, many having been on the market for a long time. Looking for statistics on numbers of homes for sale as a proportion of the total number of houses in town, it looks like about 5% of the houses in Leyden are currently listed on real estate websites. This is more than twice the percentage of homes listed for sale in nearby large towns such as Greenfield and Amherst. I can't provide statistics to prove this, but the comments in our Town Meeting indicate that young families with children of school age don't want to buy homes in a town without broadband access. This in turn affects property values for all homeowners.”

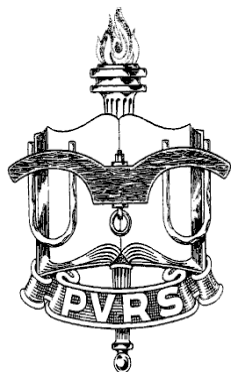

Dear PVRS Community Member,

This is our 13th year sponsoring the Pioneer Valley Regional School's Holiday Cheer Program. After a parent recently referred to the program as "Family Cheer," we decided to rename it. After all, its sole purpose is to bring some relief and a smile to families in need.

This program began in 2001 and since that time, many families have been assisted. The program grew in scope in 2008 with the poor economy. We help families with more than gifts. Now we provide assistance with heat, electricity, phone, rent, gasoline, food. Tough times continue for many.

Our rural community school has students coming from PVRSD's four towns of Bernardston, Leyden, Northfield, and Warwick; school choice students from Athol, Buckland, Colrain, Erving, Gill, Greenfield, Leverett, Montague, Orange, Royalston and West Hampton. In addition, we have several tuition students from Vernon, Vermont. Approximately 28 % of our students receive free or reduced lunch. As the holidays approach, many of our families struggle to meet financial household needs, and having a little something left over for gifts becomes a difficulty. Over the past several years, we have been able to help approximately 43 families, or about 141 individuals. With the support of local businesses, students, friends, family, and community, we have been able to bring some "cheer" to those in need.

We are once again reaching out to you in order to keep this wonderful annual tradition of giving alive. Help comes in many forms – a check (payable to PVRSD; memo line: Family Cheer 2013), cash, gift certificates, fuel assistance, movie passes, gas and food cards, etc. Whatever you can give or want to do to help will be greatly appreciated. You can reach us by phone, email, or regular mail. Thank you so much for your consideration and time. We are very grateful.





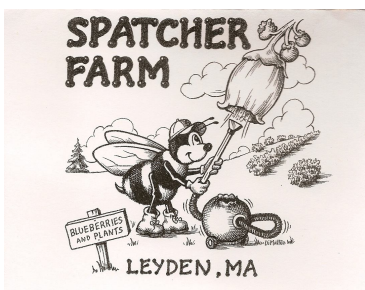
