Selectboard Corner

The Leyden Selectboard, Jeff, Barbara, and Bill wish you all a Happy New Year. We have a full agenda lined up for 2014 and we're eager to move forward on many of those items and projects.

We closed out 2013 with a Special Town Meeting on December 9th that transferred \$12,500 from Stabilization to cover town building maintenance and a door at PVRS. Leyden's Stabilization account is in good shape, with a balance of \$107,969, well above what the state recommends. Our finance team has been busy getting all financial data into Massachusetts DOR for Leyden's certification of free cash.

It was 50 years ago that the Leyden Selectboard used free cash to fund an article to install running water for the town hall, fire station and the church. Free Cash is an important part of our budgeting process. It gives the town a means of doing those types of projects. We are hoping to ask the residents to consider some of these funds to help refurbish the Town Hall kitchen and add some much-needed office space.

We're happy to report that the Paul and Phil Zimmerman families have given the Town the parcel of land the library sits on, along with enough land for future growth. Their Mother, Marion Zimmerman was an avid reader and Continued on Page 3

Building Needs Study Committee Call For New Members

The Building Needs Study Committee (BNSC), a town committee appointed by the Select Board annually, is looking for new members. The committee puts together information on projects that the board is interested in accomplishing. The most recent visible project was the Town Hall ADA Compliance Renovation Project of a few years ago, which installed a new elevator, stage lift, and handicapped-accessible restrooms in Town Hall.

We are looking for anyone who is interested in helping the Town with building projects like this or smaller. It would be helpful if the person had some knowledge of renovating or building structures in a real or abstract sense, but that is not a necessity. It is important that an interested person be willing to spend a couple of hours every month or two meeting to discuss on-going plans. That usually means additional time doing some research to provide usable data for the Select Board. Then it might mean involvement in putting plans together to accomplish the building task.

Before we welcome the New Year, let's look back upon the library's centennial year and all that occurred. Countless trustee meetings with invited guests (workers!) resulted in a really nice year of celebration.

Thanks to Cindy LeBlanc, we held a 'What is Leyden Reading' program until school vacation. Cindy selected month-appropriate articles to invite readers back in time to the year of the library's inception, 1913, and the early years of the twentieth century.

In February, and quite unplanned, the furnace died and had to be replaced. What a blessing in disguise—gone is the odor of mold, and the new furnace is much more efficient!

In March, Rich DiMatteo became a volunteer trustee, and we struck gold again! Rich was incredibly important in the success of the big May Coffee House Centennial Party. Town Hall was rocking on May 11, as 'more people gathered in one place in Leyden than I've ever seen,' a comment of many party attendees. Poets, readers, musicians and artists presented their works. David LeBlanc and the Zydeco Connection lit the place up with their lively music and fun, and the food was not only delicious but plentiful! The PRES Chorus opened the program with a few songs from the early 1900s, and your wild trustees rewrote the lyrics to Paul Simon's "Mrs. Robinson" into a song about Mr. Robertson, our library's benefactor. The trustees performed this to the delight of all. Kay and Mike Dougherty's gift of a fabulous birthday cake topped the evening off!

The renovations to the interior of the library have made a tremendous difference in its brightness and space. By removing the closet and its stairs to the basement, we gained a whole wall for bookcases and were able to separate existing bookcases to allow more ease of movement for patrons. Karen Loomis donated a book case, and Rich installed and painted it, even adding a little storage cabinet at the base to store cleaning supplies. Carolyn and I ripped up (literally) the ugly carpeting to expose a beautiful maple floor, cleaned with a vengeance, and reorganized the books to make things work more efficiently (Lois Feldman and Rachel Rodgers helped a lot!) The library looks great, and the rug Carolyn selected is bright and welcoming!

Another facet of the centennial celebration was the creation of the now famous recipe book edited by Ginny Rockwood and Lois Feldman. We are into our fourth printing with people buying multiple copies to give as gifts to friends and their own family members. Last but not least are the RML mugs, only two of which remain (\$10), and the anticipated arrival of twenty copies of The History of Leyden, eighteen of which are already called for, occurred just before the holidays! There are two copies available at this writing (\$30.)

As we welcome a new year, make the Robertson Memorial Library a part of your life. Why purchase a book, CD, or DVD, if you can borrow it!

(Continued from Page 1) enjoyed the library very much. This gift by her sons, and her long community support, will be written into our annual town meeting for acceptance.

We also are happy to report that the Herron family has donated eleven-plus acres behind PRES for future plans that might include hiking trails. This also will be written into town meeting for acceptance. Both properties have been transferred over to the town and recorded in the Registry of Deeds.

The new highway truck has arrived, and David Brooks has been busy getting it into service and hauling sand with it. We have also declared surplus equipment that the town no longer needs. There is a 1993 Ford dump truck, including an eleven-foot plow and sander. There is also a 1986 police motorcycle, dual purpose bike (road and off-road) with only 1,000 miles on it. Minimum bids are \$3,000.00 for the truck and \$2,000.00 for the bike. All bids must be received by January 15th, addressed to the Board of Selectmen. Bids will be reviewed by the board and awarded to the highest bidder at or above the required minimum bid for that item.

In other news the Police Department has advised the Selectboard of excessive speed on Brattleboro road. They have politely put out the speed board for courtesy, but unfortunately it has been ignored. We support enforcement of speed limits. This is a warning by the Board that Police officers will issue speeding tickets, and not warnings, for speeds over the limit. There have also been reports of vehicles not stopping at the stop sign at the bottom of Frizzell Hill.

Also there are still some dogs that have not been licensed. This is a public health issue regarding rabies. This Board has used numerous Town resources and funds for enforcement. We have instructed the dog officer, handled by the Police Department, to take corrective action to ensure public safety.

Leyden Life is a very important tool for reaching out to the community, and the Selectboard will continue to use it to inform people and build support for our 2014 agenda.

News from Preschool & Kindergarten

In math we are continuing to work on counting and number identification. Everyday a student leader helps us to count the number parade, and make addition equations on the 120 poster. Students have been practicing counting by tens and are learning about math drawings (how to represent numbers with a quick symbolic picture). We've also been playing number bingo and learning about shapes. Children have used pattern blocks to make shapes and fill in shape puzzles. The kindergarten class is working hard on the numbers 11-19 and learning to conserve the ten in teen numbers. For example, if we are thinking about the number 13 we can see it as one group of ten plus three ones. We use manipulatives, math drawings, and our fingers to help us do this work.

In literacy we continue to work on our alphabet. Children are learning to identify capital and lowercase letters and are thinking about the sounds that each letter can make. Kindergarten will soon be transferring these skills to their reading and writing. We also do weekly lessons in our Handwriting Without Tears books, where children focus on proper letter formation. Recently we introduced the stamp and see screens to the preschool class where they used mini magna doodle type boards to stamp letters with magnets, and then practice writing them on the boards with a magnet pen.

Please remember to send in warm mittens, hats, boots, and snow pants for outdoor recess. Also check to see that your child has an extra set of clothing appropriate for the winter season. If you have not sent in a snack for our classroom recently please consider picking up a snack over the winter break. We are down to our last boxes of Cheerios and goldfish.


