The June WiredWest Board of Directors meeting, which was originally scheduled for June 10th was postponed until June 24th, and thus occurred after our deadline for the July Leyden Life. Sheila attended. Major topics discussed were modifications to the Bylaw to (1) allow new member towns to join WiredWest, (2) for member towns that do not sign up to have their network managed by WiredWest to retain non-voting membership in WiredWest, and (3) for non-member towns that wish to have WiredWest manage their network become "Affiliates". Also discussed were changes to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) towns will be asked to sign by November in order to have their networks managed as part of the regional WiredWest Network.

There were no WiredWest Board meetings in July or August, although the Executive Committee met several times. The next Board of Directors meeting is scheduled for September 13, so we may be able to report on it in the next Leyden Life. This meeting should finalize the MOU. Whether or not Leyden decides to sign the MOU, we think Leyden residents will want to look at it and compare what WiredWest asks towns to agree with to whatever any competitor proposes. The current draft can be seen on the www.wiredwest.net website.

Also coming up: The Town of Heath will host a conference on "MLPs: What Towns Need to Know" on September 22nd. The subject will be Municipal Lighting Plant (MLP) accounting and management, with special focus on legal and accounting matters pertaining to building and operating a broadband network. The subject matter will be relevant to accountants and town officials of all towns with MLP's regardless of whether they participate in WiredWest's plans. Town leaders have been invited, and have been asked to pre-register by September 15th. The announcement is posted on the www.wiredwest.net website.

Broadband Committee

BROADBAND UPDATE Who's That Coming Up Your Driveway?

The broadband project is now moving ahead quickly. On May 25th, the Select Board executed a contract with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for our promised grant of \$680,000. With the unanimous recommendation of the Broadband Committee, the Select Board also signed an agreement with Westfield Gas & Electric (WG+E) to act as Leyden's Project Manager. With their guidance, Leyden has hired the firm of Precision Valley Communications (PVC) of Springfield, VT to do the necessary design and engineering work. PVC will also be helping us complete the necessary licensing and pole applications to Verizon and Eversource so that we can get an estimate on the cost to make all of the utility poles ready for the addition of the Town's fiber optic line.

Your driveway will most likely be visited by PVC between now and mid-September. They will be driving vehicles that say "Whip City Fiber" (a division of WG+E) on the side. Their access to your property is necessary in order to design the Town's broadband network. We need to know the length of each driveway in Town and whether the utility access to your house is aerial or underground. If you're at home when they come, they will introduce themselves. If you don't want to allow them on your property, please call me (Bob Ryan 624-0225). Keep in mind that running broadband cable to your house will add resale value to your home, is being paid for out of existing tax dollars, and creates no obligation to subscribe to broadband service. Should you refuse to allow broadband to be brought to your house, you save nothing in real estate taxes and simply miss a bump up in the value of your home/property.

Assuming the projected cost of making the poles ready is no more than 25% over original estimates, Project Manager WG+E currently projects having broadband available to Leyden residents by the fall of 2018.

Although we're hardly done yet, I want to thank some of the people helping to make this possible. First and foremost, many thanks to Bill Glabach, Lance Fritz and Jeff Neipp for the Select Board's unwavering commitment to this project. Also, my sincerest and special thanks to fellow members of the Broadband Committee Bob Anson, David Curtis and Tom Luck (the worker bees) who have put a lot of time and effort into getting this project to where it is today. And finally, thanks to our WiredWest delegates Sheila Hourihan and Al Woodhull, who have had their shoulder to the wheel, and their hearts and souls into this, a lot longer than the rest of us.


