

WiredWest

Fifteen towns, totaling just under 8,000 residences, have now signed on to work with WiredWest to be their network operator. This gives WiredWest bargaining power with Westfield Gas & Electric to set rates and participate in designing the network. It also makes it more likely that some of the smaller hill towns can eventually get connected.

Shutesbury's joining was a real turning point. They sent out a very detailed Request for Information to a number of companies to see if they might be interested in bidding to operate their network. They got two responses, one of which was from WG&E which was the standard bid we have all accepted, and the other did not match WiredWest's plan. You can see the bids at www.wiredwest.net, always a good source of information about the work being done for all our towns.






