Tucker, the Library Dog

In the spring of 2009, Tucker, a handsome English Springer Spaniel, became Trueman Robbin's 'best' dog. A rescue from New York state, Tucker moved to Leyden when he was about a year and a half old. He became a regular at the library, joining Trueman who stopped in every Monday and Wednesday to do odd jobs, visit with me and with patrons, and eventually join the ranks of trustee. Whether Trueman was trimming bushes, watering the flowers in the window boxes, shoveling snow, or repairing something, Tucker was *always* by his side.

About two years ago, Tucker suffered an accident at his groomer's resulting in nerve damage to his leg. Thus began a gradual decline in his health, vim, and vigor. But Tucker continued to visit the library, helped to make little children feel comfortable around a big dog, and readily accepted the love and petting of visitors.

This winter was hard on Tucker. His health continued to decline, and on Tuesday, February 13, 2018, Tucker was laid to rest at the South Deerfield Veterinary Clinic. I was fortunate to be with Tucker and Trueman; his passage was very peaceful. Tucker will live on in the happy memories of his presence in our lives.

Broadband Committee

Broadband Update Still Moving Forward

As we write this update, we have just received clarification that 90-95% of any poles that need to be replaced in Leyden as part of the broadband project will be fully paid for by the State. This piece of the project has been a critical concern and we are most grateful to Governor Baker for making this happen. With this promise of new state money, we can now move comfortably forward if we need to replace a lot of poles in Town.

Detailed engineering drawings of the fiber network have already been completed. At the same time, a site plan has been developed to locate a necessary "Telecommunications Hut" on a town-owned piece of land on Brattleboro Road, opposite Pearl Rhodes School. It will be built next summer.

We are now beginning the process of filing applications with Verizon and Eversource to find out what it will cost for them to make all of their poles ready for the addition of our fiber. This process and the subsequent actual rewiring/replacement of many of the poles in town will obviously take some time. Leyden is just one of 21 towns simultaneously striving for broadband access. Between now and the end of August, Verizon and Eversource will be asked to start work on 20,000 poles across western Mass.

It is now estimated that we will begin hanging wire in the first quarter of 2019, with the expectation that we will have the broadband network up and running by August of 2019. These dates are certainly farther out than we were originally told, but are now much more realistic.

I want to take this occasion to especially thank two new members of the Broadband team, Dave Vreeland and Sam Bartlett. Dave has volunteered to manage the design and construction of the new Telecommunications Hut. This is no easy task, since we've asked him to make it look like a sugar house. Sam came to our aid when we started receiving large engineering CAD files from our Project Manager and couldn't quite figure out what to do with them. Sam has volunteered to manage the final drop program which will bring fiber from the street to each of the homes in town. Again, no small task.

As always, my thanks to the other members of the broadband team - Bob Anson, Dave Curtis, Tom Luck, and Selectman Lance Fritz for their help and guidance.
