# **Select Board**

Select Board Agenda:

Pearl Rhodes Elementary School (PRES) opened its doors in 1951 with 2 classrooms, a cafeteria and indoor plumbing. The three one-room school houses, Center, South and Beaver Meadow, closed. There were approximately 48 students. Forty years went by educating Leyden students in two rooms. In 1991 Leyden voted to take on a 20-year note to renovate PRES to its present state, with only minimal State aid. The Town also voted to regionalize our elementary grades with the Pioneer district in anticipation of more State aid and better school programs. At its peak in the 1990s PRES was educating 108 Leyden students.

We're now looking at a building almost 70 years old, a school committee agenda of school closings, and a newly-formed Heart Committee working with State officials on how best to resolve the debt issues of the Pioneer district. A new emergency aid package passed in the General Court and signed by Governor Baker should help Pioneer with its debt issues, but it also gives the State overseer complete control over spending in the district. In short, the State could close PRES with Leyden having no say in the matter.

We attended a School Committee meeting on December 13<sup>th</sup>. Discussion at that meeting included how to inform Towns

of the 180-day notice of their lease agreements with the towns. Many changes to education in the district are being discussed. If you're a parent or anticipate that your kids might be affected, you might consider attending these open School Committee meetings, or contact your School Committee representatives. Changes are coming.

We are in talks with the Greenfield Fire Department and mayor regarding the possibility of Greenfield taking over our fire calls and fire protection services. With the many changes and mandates in OSHA it's getting to a point where it's driving the volunteerism out of the fire service. Greenfield is very interested, so we will continue to talk. Hopefully we'll be able to put something in place so that Leyden would officially have a full-time Fire Department with a good response time.

A call came in early in the morning recently for a chimney fire. The Greenfield Fire Department arrived first on the scene, ahead of Bernardston, followed by Leyden in last place. Response time out of Greenfield appears not to be an issue at this point. Training and certification of equipment, cost of replacement, and retention of manpower are all factors that are changing the fire service as stated in the FRGOG report done in 2013. It's now a reality that we have to make some changes. Our 2008 Pierce Fire tanker truck would be part of the deal, where Greenfield would be responding with that piece of equipment.

Town departments worked in the closing weeks of November to get all information in to DOR to get free cash certification for the upcoming year. Our town was notified that Leyden was certified by DOR for \$143,599, almost double what we got last year. We're in good shape as we approach the fiscal 2020 budget year.

In closing, we're midway into the winter months with road conditions that can change within minutes. Drive carefully, and respect the snow plow trucks when they're out on the road. The history of Leyden tells us winter is not a season, it's an occupation; we're considered a town with full employment. Take some time off and grab a coffee or lunch with the COA on Wednesdays. They're doing a great service for the town. Thank you COA and all those who help with these gatherings.

Wednesday, January 23<sup>rd</sup> ~ Medicare for Seniors: Avoiding a Scam Program ~ 11:00AM

FRTA comes to Leyden! ~ Beginning on the first of January, FRTA (Franklin Regional Transit Authority) will begin on-demand, limited service to Leyden for those over age 60, or who are handicapped. Before being able to use the service, residents must fill out an application form available at Town Hall (or by calling FRTA at 413-774-2262 or download it from their website: www.frta.org ) and attach a photo copy of a valid driver's license and send it in to FRTA. (the address is on the application). There is a one-way fee of \$2.75, which is payable in exact change or with a FRTA prepaid card. No checks or credit cards are accepted. For someone who needs a care-giver, the one-way fee for that person is \$.75. FRTA needs 48 hours' notice. The busses are wheelchair accessible. As of December 17<sup>th</sup>, if you have filled out forms and been approved, they will begin taking ride requests for transportation to go to doctor's appointments or grocery shopping in Greenfield.
