Select Board

Leyden's Annual Town Meeting will be held Saturday May 18th at 9:00 AM. Town elections will also be held the same day. Light refreshments will be available for a noontime recess.

The Selectmen still don't have the corrected figures for Pioneer's assessment. We have been told that PRES is closing, but the figures we have are based on its staying open. Numbers at town meeting might have to be amended. We anticipate a lengthy discussion on Pioneer, as the Selectboard is not in favor of the decisions the school committee has made in regard to the savings from the closure of PRES. This district remains in a \$450,000 deficit and they continue to spend with no regard to the needs of the towns. The closure of PRES will result in roughly a \$2500 savings for the town; we feel this is totally unacceptable for closing our school. We were successful in convincing the budget subcommittee to return \$11,300 to Leyden to offset the cost of heating the building until it can be repurposed for town use, possibly in 2020.

The Leyden school advisory committee has met numerous times with Bernardston's advisory committee and have been working to make the transition of Leyden students very smooth and inviting into their new school building in Bernardston. Parents will be invited as well in the near future, as many events are planned to make this change go well. During April we held three informational meetings in regard to the inter-government agreement we reached with Greenfield about contracting out our fire service. During the process we continued to gather information, and prior to going before Greenfield's City Council, it was determined that evaluations and remapping the ISO maps would not be complete prior to the agreements being voted on. It was decided by both Greenfield and Leyden to wait and further the study with the help of the FRCOG and outside sources, to determine if remapping into one map would work for both communities. We were originally told both ISO maps would work for insurance rates, but after the second informational meeting we were told both maps would have to be combined, possibly changing some of the ratings in both communities. Those evaluations and remapping would not take place until after the fact and that was obviously unacceptable. Additional expenditures for bringing in personnel and equipment will be added to the Warrant at Town Meeting as there is not time on our side to get everything done.

Chapter 90 road projects this year will include the repaving of Mid County Road. It was a relatively mild winter and winter

maintenance money was returned into the machinery account, so David could replace the body on our 4-wheel dump truck. We have also met with Eversource officials in Hadley regarding why it is taking so long to reroute the three-phase power that serves West Leyden residents. We were told work would begin in the first quarter of 2019.

Nicole Glabach has been appointed inspector of barns and animals. We thank Chuck Foley for his dedicated years in making sure livestock in Leyden had a safe environment with proper shelter and clean water. Nicole will be making the rounds later in the year if you have livestock.

There will be a Memorial Day service on the Town Common Monday May 27th at 10:30 AM. Sunday May 26th at 2:00 PM Bill Glabach will be looking for help in placing flags on the graves of veterans who have served this country. All veterans should have a brass or aluminum flag holder with the war or time period they served. If you find that one is missing, please make notation and give to Bill so we can get flag holders. This is a day of remembrance for the men and women who have served to secure our freedom and democracy for all Americans. I recently had the pleasure to speak with one of our World War II residents at a Veterans lunch. He remarked to me, "You know, we would look at one another and say, 'Which one of us is going to die today?' as we were parachuting out of the plane in the Pacific Theater". We live in a very peaceful community because of these men and women. Please join Bill and remember your thoughts of what Memorial Day means for you.
