## Selectboard

Many thanks to the Recreation Committee, especially John Higgins, Brian Pelletier, and Karin Parks, for inviting Santa to Leyden for the annual Christmas program for the kids. Parents and grandparents had a great time as well. The Hardesty room at Town Hall was filled with joy for the Christmas season.

All the town offices and committees have been moved to the former PRES. Everyone has been busy setting up their offices and the town is fully in operation. All committee and board meetings will be held at 7 Brattleboro Road, Town of Leyden Municipal Offices. The bulletin board for posting announcements and meetings is located right next to the main entrance. This is the official posting board. Selectboard postings can also be found on the Leyden Website.

The Selectboard recently held its annual tax classification hearing with the assessors. A single tax rate was adopted with a tax rate of \$17.01. Leyden's tax rate went down but evaluations will be increasing slightly to com-

pensate for the needs of the town annual budget. As we go into the new budget year, Leyden is in good shape with stabilization funds set aside for future planning to offset budget increases or capital expenditures.

On December 9<sup>th</sup> the Selectboard held a Special Town Meeting to address 7 warrant articles. All articles were transfers from free cash with no direct impact on property taxes. The remaining free cash of \$65,034.00 was voted into the town stabilization fund. One article that was funded with free cash was to set up reverse 911 for Leyden residents. By signing up prior to December 13<sup>th</sup> Leyden saved an additional \$2000.00. The company, with assistance from Chief Galvis, will be gathering information as to how you would prefer to be notified in case of a public emergency. It is clear that if we stay on top of the changing times with technology, grant funding will be more available to our town. We must do the set-up work to be a viable community for things coming to rural towns.

December 2<sup>nd</sup> gave us a good old northeaster snowstorm. Heavy snow of depths of 2 feet blanketed many areas of Leyden. Our highway crew did a terrific job keeping the roads open for travel. Thank you David, Bill and Eric for all those long hours removing tons of snow off the roads. We remind ourselves that during the summer months David and Bill worked rebuilding the second dump truck from top to bottom to keep our well-maintained fleet of snow removal equipment in top shape so we don't have breakdowns. Your hard work and leadership is much appreciated, David! The Town thanks your department.

The Selectboard is considering renting out unused space at Town of Leyden Municipal Offices. The Virtual Commonwealth school has sent a proposal to our office. We are reviewing their proposal and could draw up a lease agreement that could serve their needs and also benefit Leyden. They would rent the north corner classroom that overlooks Avery field for computer tutoring. We feel there would be no impact on the daily functions of the building. The lease would run from January 1st 2020 to June 30th 2020, with a possible 3-year lease.

Michele has been in contact once again with the Sheriff's inmate work program. They are slated to begin painting the town offices for us in February. This will be a great help as the building is in need of wall repair and painting. Last year they painted three buildings for the town and saved us a considerable amount of money.

The old parking area above the school is closed off for the winter. We don't need the space and will access it come spring.

If you are looking for the Blue U.S. postal box it has been moved to 7 Brattleboro Road in front of the Town offices at PRES, per the decision of the Bernardston postmaster for better convenience for them as well as us.

The freezer at PRES has been declared surplus. If interested in bidding, please contact Michele at 774-4111 and submit a bid. Bids will be opened up on January 27<sup>th</sup> at the Selectboard's meeting with the award going to the high bidder. Bidder will be responsible for removing freezer and it will be sold as- is.

In closing, the Selectboard continues to attend school committee meetings gathering information on the district's budget. One thing we're working on is Leyden's identity over at BES. The Selectboard raised the issue and our school committee members in town are addressing it. Many things are going on with the school district so follow their Facebook pages as well as the Pioneer and elementary websites to stay on top of education in our district.

Big things are headed our way!


- December 30th at 10:30am the library is having a pajama party at the auditorium of the town hall. We will be showing the movie 'Elf' and will have fun for all ages.



## Climate Corner

"Kids these days!" A familiar phrase often borne of frustration. Might it be better to credit them when we encounter their informed passion and their optimism? Currently Greta Thunberg, 16 years of age, appears as a standard bearer for climate action. Cast as a "pawn" or "puppet" by naysayers, she is, to me, an intense version of many young people I got to know during more than 40 years in education. Many of those students, who have navigated a world in which some adults have discouraged their ambitions, go on to achieve quite remarkable goals. Informed passion for survival of the planet should be celebrated and encouraged, rather than looked upon with suspicion.

A few weeks ago, I visited three Ecology classes at Pioneer Valley Regional School to facilitate 90 minutes of learning and reflection on the Climate Crisis. In three parts, students first briefly referred to terms they had heard in relation to climate and what they might mean, followed next by a detailed look at trends and data, and finally, making connections to their current topic of study: the web of life. The students were thoughtful, involved and responsive. In the spring their studies will take them back to an emphasis on sustainability where they will focus on specific solutions.

Our schools are often doing a fine job of encouraging an understanding of the scientific and social issues surrounding the Climate Crisis. I base this on the fact that a significant number of the Franklin County Superintendent of Schools Award winners recently honored cited climate issues as their intended college and career focus. These outstanding seniors in county high schools want to make a difference.

"Kids these days" deserve our praise for their commitment to a better world. We can all, young and older, engage with them and offer sincere encouragement. They are not pawns; they have tremendous potential for positive change. So stay well in the New Year, and share this column with the young people in your life.
