#### DEPARTMENTAL REVOLVING FUNDS

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. This by-law establishes and authorizes revolving funds for use by Town departments, boards, and committees, in connection with the operation of programs or activities that generate fees, charges or other receipts to support all or some of the expenses of those programs or activities. These revolving funds are established under and governed by General Laws Chapter 44, Sec. 53E½.
- 2. <u>Expenditure Limitations</u>. A department, board, or committee head may incur liabilities against and spend monies from a revolving fund established and authorized by this by-law without appropriation subject to the following instructions:
  - A. Fringe benefits of full-time employees whose salaries or wages are paid from the fund shall also be paid from the fund.
  - B. No liability shall be incurred in excess of the available balance of the fund.
  - C. The total amount spent during a fiscal year shall not exceed the amount authorized by Town Meeting on or before July 1 of that fiscal year, or any increased amount of that authorization that is later approved during that fiscal year, or any increased amount of that authorization that is later approved during that fiscal year by the Selectboard and the Finance Committee.
- 3. <u>Interest</u>. Interest earned on monies credited to a revolving fund established by this by-law shall be credited to the general fund.
- 4. Procedures and Reports. Except as provided in General Laws Chapter 44, Sec. 53E½ and this by-law, the laws, charter provisions, by-laws, rules, regulations, policies, or procedures that govern the receipt and custody of Town monies and the expenditure and payment of Town funds shall apply to the use of a revolving fund established and authorized by this by-law. The Town Accountant shall include a statement on the collections credited to each fund, the encumbrances and expenditures charged to the fund and the balance available for expenditure in the regular report the Town Accountant provides the department, board, or committee on appropriations made for its use.
- 5. <u>Authorized Revolving Funds</u>. Revolving funds established and authorized by this by-law shall begin on or after July1, 2018, and shall include:

#### Citizens' Safety Bylaw

Section 1. In addition to any applicable provision of state law regarding the regulation and licensing of hunting and/or firearms, no person shall fire or discharge any firearm or weapon of any kind within the limits of any park, playground or other public property of the Town, except with the consent of the Board of Selectmen, or other Town governmental body with jurisdiction over such property. Nor shall any person fire or discharge any firearm, or weapon of any kind on any private property, except with the written consent, to be in the person's possession, of the owner or legal occupant thereof.

Section 2. This bylaw shall not apply to the lawful defense of life or property, not to any law enforcement officer acting in the discharge of his duties.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this article shall be fined \$200 for each offense, and any weapon used in the commission of said offense shall be confiscated by a law enforcement officer. This by-law shall not apply to the lawful defense of life or property or to any law enforcement officer acting in the discharge of his or her duties. The Leyden Police Department, the Massachusetts Environmental Police or any sworn police officer who has jurisdiction in the Town of Leyden may enforce this by-law. Any person in violation of this by-law may also be subject to Massachusetts laws and regulations, where applicable.
